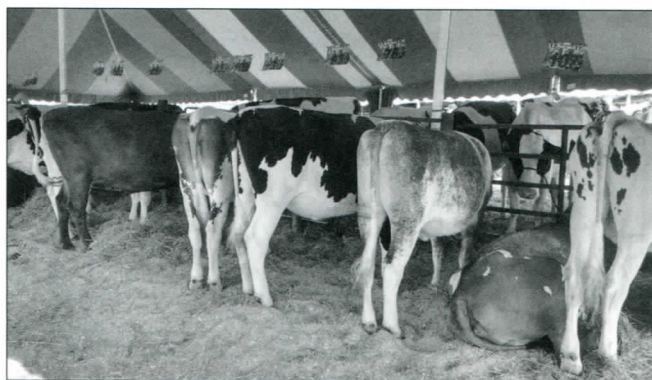


# Wall Street Dairy 10th Anniversary Sale

In his welcome letter in the front of the sale catalog, Wall Street owner Jeff Winton wrote: *"This anniversary sale has been in the works for ten years since we first established our herd. We have focused over the years on breeding high-type, high-producing cattle with unsurpassed longevity ... and we are selling the absolute top of the herd."* The warmth of Winton's in-person comments at the start of the event helped set the tone for a very successful 10th Anniversary Sale for Wall Street Dairy at the farm in Mayville, NY, on a beautiful October 21st. A fantastic lineup of the herd's very best attained a \$1802 on 93 full lots, with lively bidding throughout the event from the large crowd on hand as well as on the internet through CowBuyer.

Topping the sale at \$6,500 was lot number one, Wall-St McCutchen Ruthiana, recently scored VG-88 at 2-10, and due again in December to Headliner. A familiar show campaigner on the local and state levels, she was the Honorable Mention All-New York Fall Yearling in 2016 and was 1st Sr. 2-Yr-Old and Intermediate Champion at the 2017 Chautauqua County Holstein Show. A beautiful young cow with a spectacular udder and impressive uphill run, she was backed by a recently-made Excellent Guthrie with 1361f, then a Touchdown-Red, and eight more Excellent dams in the D-R-A August (4E-96-DOM) maternal line that has produced so many breed-impacting males & females. Lively bidding around the tent ended with Todd Winton, Jr., Sinclairville, NY, placing the final bid. He and his wife, Missy, were active buyers throughout the sale as they embark on their own "Centralia Holsteins."

At \$4,050, they also selected two of the other stellar young cows in the herd. Wall-St G W Atwood June (EX-91 @ 4-03), a beautiful, black, well-balanced Atwood daughter had 3-04 2x 301 24,963 3.7 932 3.2 793 (Inc.) and was due again in March to Dragonheart. She completes eight generations of VG & EX, with her own dam being an EX-90, EX-MS Alexander daughter with over 26,000m. At the same price was another

outstanding McCutchen daughter, Wall-St McCutchen Daisy (VG-86 @ 2-06), a very tall, long-bodied young cow with a terrific udder, loaded with "chrome" and milking well over 80 lbs. at sale time. Her dam was a Shottle daughter, then four more VG dams in the D-J Melissas Sapphire (VG-85-GMD) family, so well-known in this area of Western New York for State leading fat records to 2197f.

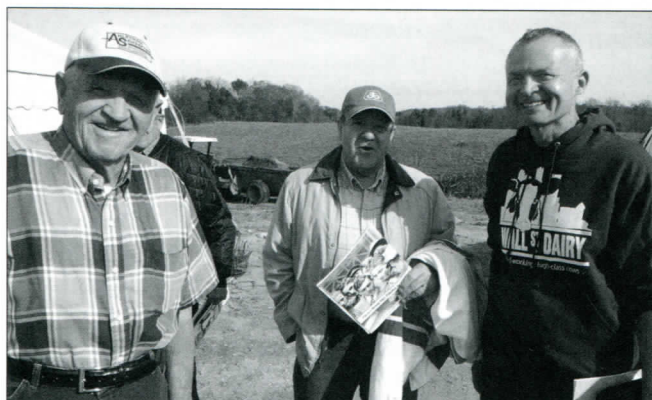
Next high on their list was Wall-St G W Atwood Icicle (VG-86 @ 2-09) and making a good record at 2-03 and due again in June to McCutchen. A fancy young cow with a high, wide rear udder and all the makings of a high-scoring cow in the future, her dam was an EX-91 Spring-Fed-bred Aftershock with 1058f, followed by a VG-87 Iv-Ann with 255,770 4.0 10,287 3.3 8564, then six more dams in the Carl-A Chief Faith (3E-91 GMD-DOM) family.

Several head went to the Keystone State including another of the herd's best young cows, Wall-St Bradnick Seder (GP-83 @ 3-09), a fancy Regancrest-GV S Bradnick-ET daughter with 118 lbs. on her latest test. Her dam was another of the foundation Spring-Fed cows, Spring-Fed Apple Sadee-Red (VG-86), then four more VG dams with records to 1159f. Timothy Ludwick, Sugar Grove, PA, placed the final bid at \$3,100.

The sale was managed by The Cattle Exchange with Dave Rama doing the selling and Daniel Brandt highlighting the impressive pedigrees. Don Welk and Russ George accepted bids from around the ring and Merry Rama and Jeannie Nichols were at the clerk's table. Several incentives for junior/youth buyers and local purchasers also added to the event's success and each buyer received a gallon of local apple cider pressed the morning of the sale.
